School Topic's this term are as follows -

#### **Derwen Bach**

This term our topic is 'Buildings and Homes'. Children will be learning about the types of homes they live in, home safety and will design and create their own dream home. Children will also be learning about homes and important buildings from around the world as well as homes from the past. We will also explore what different homes are made from through the story of the three little pigs.







### Onnen

Year 2 & 3 will be investigating castles. We will be finding out where they are in Wales and why they were built. We will also look at how castles changed through history. We will be visiting Denbigh Castle and then writing a recount about the visit. We will also find out what jobs people had in a castle and use this information to write job advertisements and diary entries. In Art we will be looking at tapestries and the children will create their own designs which they will then turn into a cross stitch. This links with their maths as they will be using symmetry in their designs.

## Celyn

## Disasters that made history: The Titanic.

In Celyn class this Autumn term, the children will investigate who was to blame for the sinking of the Titanic, looking at various roles people had to play in the disaster, and will write a balanced argument as well as debating this orally. The children will be looking at a timeline of events, as well as analysing primary and secondary historical sources related to the disaster. In our 'Philosophy' lessons the children will look discuss and debate classism and prejudice that may have been present on board the Titanic. In Expressive Arts, the children will complete artwork 'through the ship window' using a variety of different artistic tools, as well as creating dramatic freeze frames to demonstrate the scenes before, during and after the sinking. In Music, our Charanga module for this half term is 'Mama Mia!'. In Science, the children will investigate and experiment with properties of materials, floating and sinking, as well as water resistance. These are just some of the exciting activities for this term's topic!

## **Attendance**

Children do suffer from coughs and colds, however unless they are running a temperature they can still come to school. There is guidance on the NHS website if you are unsure.
